



Vincent van Gogh

What did he paint?






Vincent was difficult to be around. Later in his life, he became so ill he cut off his ear.


He painted most of his works In the asylum.

Why is this painting so famous?




- Vincent's unique personality and romantic/tragic life story


Let's talk about texture.



Texture is an element of art that refers to the way thing feel or they appear to feel.



We will learn to make the **visual texture** that you can see



as well the **actual** texture that you feel with your fingers

How do we make it?

We will combine the modeling paste with acrylic paint









- It helps us create texture you can feel
- It is easy to make cool texture that stays the way you want it
- It dries faster than if we used only paint
- It is fun!



How do we use it?

Mix it into the paint



And play around with it

Visual texture





We will start with visual texture.

Combine blue and purple on your paper and spread it with a popsicle stick.

Actual texture





Mix yellow (or orange or white) with the medium

Use the stick or your fingers to paint the stars and the Sun.

Let's draw the panorama of your city.

How can you simplify it to see just the panorama?

Decorate it and glue it together.



Use a silver sharpie (or a white crayon/pencil) to add details to your city.

Then glue it onto your background.
